JD was born in Indiana, Pennsylvania and graduated from Marion Center Area High School. He received his BS Degree in Organizational Leadership from the Colorado State University and is currently pursuing his MBA from the Pennsylvania State University.

He joins KECA following his extensive military service and his service to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania as a Game Warden and Deputy Game Warden. JD graduated from the Ross Leffler School of Conservation in 2022, after receiving the "Torch Award" by his peers for his outstanding leadership qualities. JD added to his extensive military leadership and game management experience by serving as a floor manager for Westinghouse Specialty Metals prior to joining as President of the Keystone Elk Country Alliance.

JD served our great country for more than 22 years in the United States Army. Kennedy Special Warfare Center and School (May 2013-July 2015); and 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion, 10<sup>th</sup> Special Forces Group (July 2015-Retirement October 2018).

Mr. Walker has attended numerous schools with a focus on "leadership." He attended the U.S. Army Airborne School, Air Assault School, Warrior Leaders Course, Advanced Leaders Course (Commandants list), U.S. Army Jumpmaster School, U.S. Army Recruiting School (Honor Graduate), Battle Staff Course, Civil Affairs Course (Commandants list), 18C Special Forces Engineer Course, Intermediate Search/Tactical Site Exploitation Course, Principles of Strategic Communications Course, Senior Leaders Course, Multiple Survival, Evasion, Resistance and Escape (SERE) High Risk Courses, Advanced Negotiations and Mediations Course, Unconventional Warfare Course, Special Forces Network Development Course, and many others.

Mr. Walker is also a member of the Army's prestigious leadership clubs, Sergeant Audie Murphy, and Sergeant Morales.

Upon his military retirement in October 2018, Mr. Walker became a Military Science Instructor at the Colorado State University, the University of Northern Colorado, the Indiana University of Pennsylvania, Saint Francis University, Mount Aloysius College, the Washington and Jefferson College, and the University of Pittsburgh. Additionally, JD served as the Veteran Support Specialist for Saint Francis University until his selection to the prestigious Ross Leffler School of Conservation. He was then assigned to Indiana County where he served as the State Game Warden until March 2023.
